



Dental Technicians Association of BC “In good standing” Policy

The following policy pertains to the Dental Technicians Association of BC [DTABC] definition of “In good standing” and it is specific to the DTABC. The intent of the policy is to provide guidance to members who are seeking nomination to the Board or nomination to a Board committee or generally seeking information about their membership.

Definition of “In good standing”

A member [of the DTABC] “in good standing” is regarded as having complied with all their explicit obligations, while not being subject to any form of sanction, suspension, disciplinary censure, or expulsion.

The **obligations** include but are not limited to:

- Annual DTABC membership dues, including PLI, are paid and current
- The member is registered with the College of Dental Technicians of BC [CDTBC] and the registration is current
- A willingness to act honestly and in good faith and in the best interests of the society
- A willingness to exercise the care, diligence, and skill of a prudent person in all membership activities
- A willingness to attempt to review and understand the DTABC bylaws
- Pride in the profession and a willingness to support and mentor other members seeking help

Should a member wish to seek nomination to the DTABC Board of Directors the following will also apply: [as per the BC Society Act]

- Respect a Duty of Care and a Duty of Loyalty as an association director
- Avoid Breach of Trust
- Represent the interest of all members
